The Volunteer Application Process - 4 Step Check List

Whether you are wanting to foster our dogs or volunteer other services, you must be willing to provide the information requested in the four steps described below.

We know this seems like a lot to ask of someone who is offering to give of their time, talents, energy, and resources! However, being a dog lover, we hope you'll understand that our top priority is to provide the safest and best care for our dogs.

Our volunteers are entrusted with the lives of our dogs and at times with confidential information so we must gather some information about you. We hope you understand our position and know that we really do appreciate your effort. The reward you'll receive from the appreciative little dogs will make the time spent on this application process all worth it!

Step 1 - Application

You must be 18 years old to apply. You must submit an application. Choose either version.

- Web Version - Submit application on-line at www.shihtzu-rescue.com.
- Printable Version - Submit application by fax, or regular mail.

Step 2 - Veterinary Records

- Ask your veterinarian to fax or mail at least the last two years of the veterinary records for your current or past pet(s). Veterinarians should still have records on file for several years back for any past pets.
- If you have never owned a pet you may skip this step.

Step 3 - References

You must have three (3) references submit a questionnaire. Only one can be a relative.

Your references may choose either version.

- Web Version - Your references may submit questionnaire on-line at www.shihtzu-rescue.com.
- Printable Version - Your references may submit questionnaire by fax, or regular mail.

Step 4 - Home Visit

Once we have received and reviewed your first three steps (completed application, vet records, and 3 completed reference questionnaires) we will schedule a time for one of our volunteers to come to your home for an interview.

During this home visit our volunteer will look around your house/apartment and yard for any potential hazards (such as poisonous house plants, gaps in fences, etc.) that may need to be corrected if you are applying to provide a foster home.
